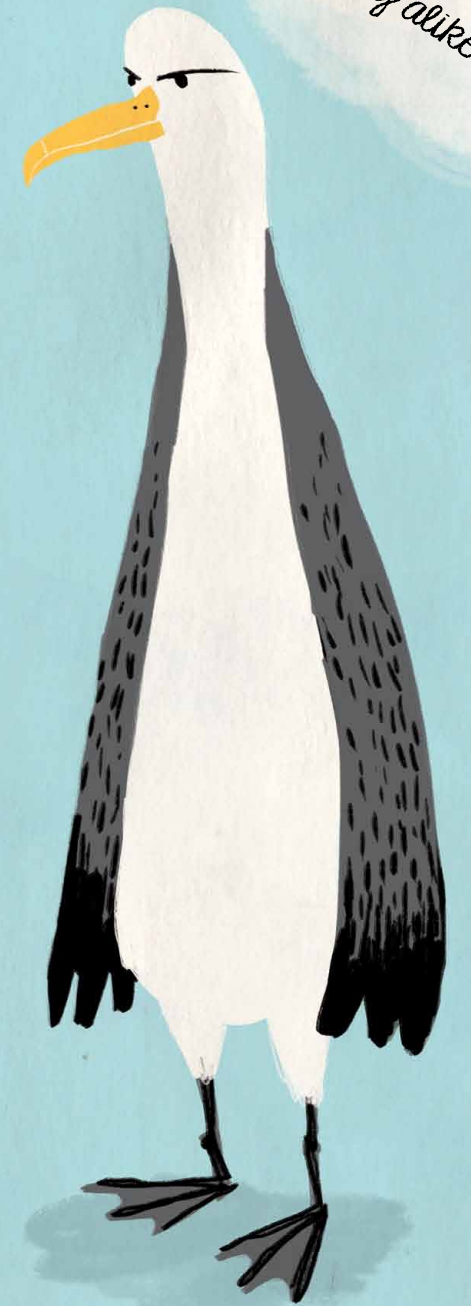

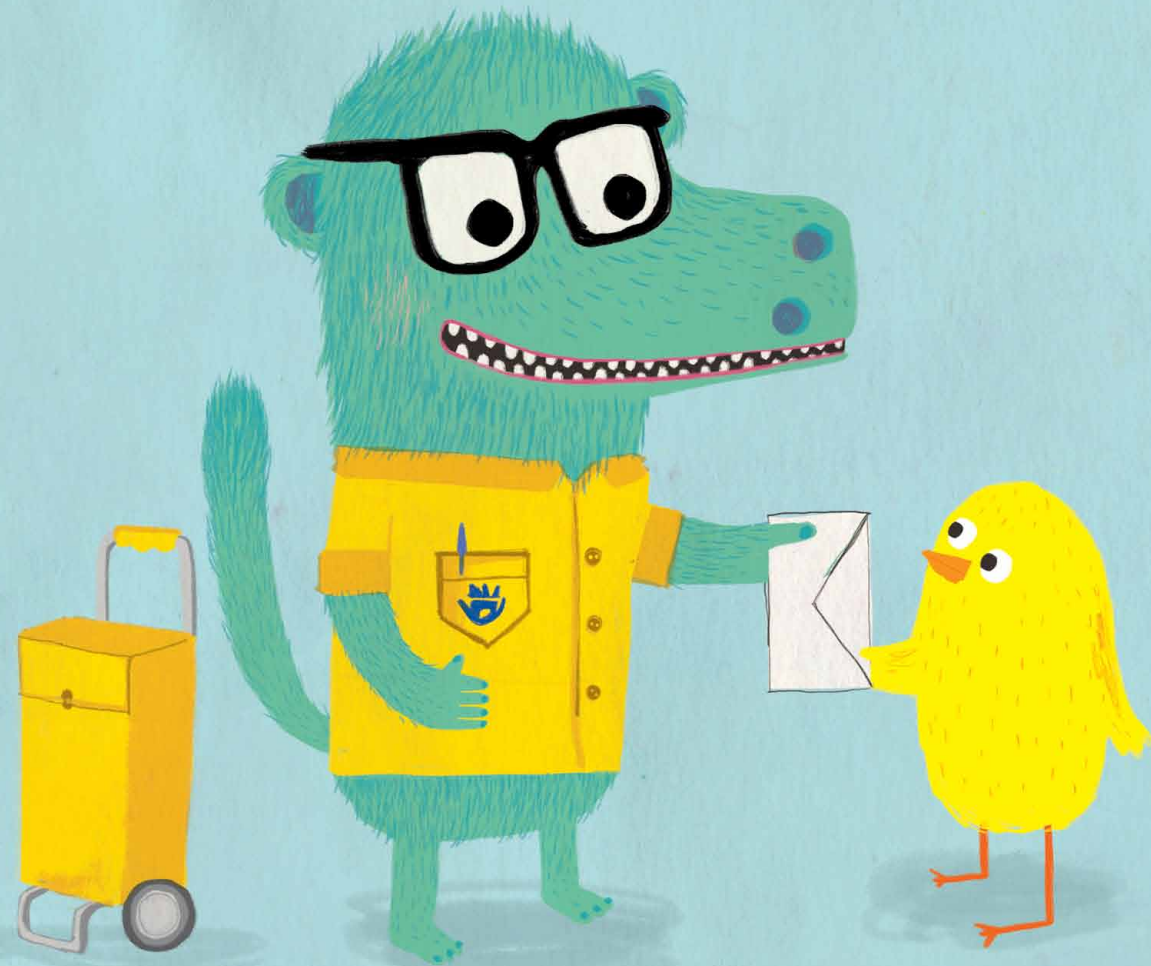


WE'LL SEND YOU A POSTCARD

...and all night working on it.

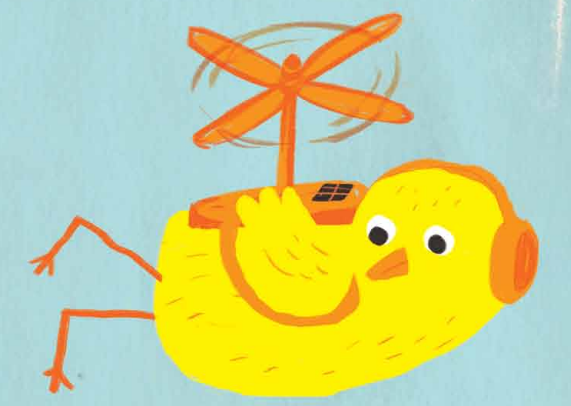
